\$50,000 "RISE OF GIRLS SPORTS" MATCHING CHALLENGE!

The Olympic Club has seen an increased demand for funding across all youth sports programs in the Bay Area and has specifically experienced a jump in applications to fund girls programs. The facts shared with us by our grantees make a very compelling case:

- 94% of female C-suite executives played sports;
- 61% of female executives say sports contributed to their career success;
- Girls who play sports report higher levels of confidence at all ages, have higher GPAs and have higher opinions of their abilities;
- Girls who are involved in sports are 14% more likely to believe that they are smart enough for their dream career.

For this reason, a generous former Olympic Club Foundation Board Member has pledged to match all donations in April to the OCF's "Rise of Girls Sports" Campaign, dollar for dollar, up to \$50,000. Let's make a difference in the lives of these girls!

"The support of The Olympic Club Foundation has specifically benefited our scholarship program. Currently, 20% of our players in our club program are on scholarship due to financial need. With the help of The Olympic Club Foundation, our goal is to increase that percentage to 40% so that we can continue to support disadvantaged girls that have less opportunities for sports, leadership, female mentoring, and competitive play. Games against other teams teach players under pressure the values of teamwork, overcoming adversity, resilience, sportsmanship, leadership, and healthy competition."
